President Mary Sander gave away two WSPAA tee shirts to ticket holders Don Mayer and Leo Sendelbach.

Mary also gave a short summary of what the WSPAA has been doing for its members; The dues remain the same at \$15.00/yr. Jan. through Dec. We provide info. to members thru email or USPS. We now have new merchandise available to members. If it is not what they are looking for, members can still order online from Queensboro for the regular stuff.

If any member wants something done, has a suggestion/complaint, contact any board member and we will discuss it. Mary communicated with members regarding Alumni Day and the WSPA. Members agreed this is where we belong as it is centrally located and brings back memories for everyone. Mary said we will be here as long as she has anything to do with it. Kim Hurley has been very successful working out any details with the Fort Mc Coy Police Department (including having Gate 15 open for us for this event!). No date has been set for next year's annual meeting, but we will let you know as soon as we have that information from the WSPA.

Mary reached out to Superintendent Burrell who has been very supportive of the WSPAA.

WSPAA pays for member's lunch and the charge for lunch for any guest is only \$10.00. Anyone with previous WSP employment history may become a member by paying \$15.00. They can also register to attend the luncheon and pay \$10.00 for the lunch if they are not a current member.

Scholarships – there have been ongoing discussions on how we could provide scholarships to interested students. We have not been able to work out the details yet so that they would be on a sustaining basis; who to provide it to, how much, what type of essay program we would use, etc. The WI Troopers Association suggested we go into a program with them; however we prefer to work it all out and go on our own.

We have been making donations to the WSP Honor Guard, WSP memorials, WTA benevolent fund. There was a short explanation on how we determine these donations. For the Honor Guard they attend out of state funerals, so there are travel and other expenses which are not covered by the State. It was also brought up that the Honor Guard will attend a WSPAA member's funeral, **BUT** you have to ask for them. Kim Hurley can be contacted to request the Honor Guard at a funeral. Motion by Bob Gohre to make a \$500.00 donation to the Honor Guard, 2nd by Jim Featherston, passed.

Treasurer Linda Woldt said that we have \$11,203.06 in checking. Some of our expenses are office supplies, postage, making copies for multiple mailings, compensation to board members and Regional Reps travel expense to attend board meetings. We have been holding them at District 4 in Wausau because it is more centrally located for everyone.

President Sander gave away a coffee mug and a travel mug to Mrs. Gifford and Xuong Tuong. Mary then placed all the previous winning tickets back in the box, so everyone is included in the final give away of a table top grill donated by Gander Outdoor.

Mike Jennings commented that this is no reflection on CD Kim Hurley, but the various newsletters have been getting later and later. Dave Collins explained that there are two different versions of the weekly

newsletters, one for internal members, the other for external or another explanation they are for sworn and unsworn. Kim Hurley shared that the weekly memo and the weekly review are two different things and come from two different people at Hill farms. And it has been the weekly review that has been slow in coming to her. Capt. Matl offered to help with this.

Captain Paul Matl explained that they have not been able to set a date for our next year annual meeting because the exact new recruit class dates are unknown at this time. Plus they have to be aware of any Fort Mc Coy operations, so nothing interferes with them. At the moment it is out of their control, but they will let us know as soon as they can.

Colonel Teasdale welcomed everyone and said that Superintendent Burrell sends his apology for not being able to be here. Colonel Teasdale explained his background and history with the WSP. He also provided a very lengthy and detailed update on the WSPA command team, goals, their budget, working with the FBI as well as other law enforcement organizations, highway safety, what they can and can't do as well as:

Technical Reconstruction including using drones – SWAT – Mobile Field Force for conventions etc. – K9 programs – Motor Carrier Enforcement – Traffic Management Center in Milwaukee – Air Support Unit – Drones – there was a very interesting and detailed presentation by Trooper Bill Lindemann.

Colonel Teasdale then held a very informative and thorough question and answer session for everyone.

At 2:53 PM President Sander provided the information that anyone wishing to renew their membership sees Treasurer Woldt in the rear of the conference room; if you wish, you can pay for more than one year at a time. Please note that if you do not renew your membership by March 31st of any given year, your name will be dropped from the membership roster and mailings.

Mary then held a drawing for the Gander Outdoor donated grill.

It was won by Lyle Sconzert ticket #348, however he graciously advised to redraw and give it to someone else.
