Meeting called to order at 9:58 AM

Motion to accept agenda made by Ray, a 2<sup>nd</sup> was by Linda, motion passes.

The Pledge of Allegiance was recited by all.

Secretary's Report – we are still at ten snail mail members. Some are those without email addresses and some have had difficulty receiving our emails. Kim mentioned getting a business account at Office Depot where we would get discounts on items needed for the executive board & history committee. Board said Kim should get the business account. Motion by Dave C. to accept the secretary's report and 2<sup>nd</sup> was made by Ray. Motion passes.

Scholarship Report – Kim reported that six applications packets had been sent in. However, one of the individuals was disqualified and was notified of their disqualification. Motion by Linda to accept the scholarship report and a 2<sup>nd</sup> was made by Anne. Motion passes.

Financial Report - Linda reported that there are 33 people signed up for the summer social at Lambeau field. She also said our expenditures are more than what we are

taking in. Our checking balance is a \$2222.85. Motion made by Dave C. that excess monies for Green Bay go to the general fund. A 2<sup>nd</sup> was made by Dave H., motion passes.

Our by-laws state that there should be an annual audit of our checking and savings accounts. The last audit was done two years ago. Linda will check with Gwen Schneider and Janet Sabatke to see if they will assist her again. Mary asked that it be done by alumni day.

Linda brought up lifetime memberships as a member had said something to her. After discussion it was agreed upon that it will be brought up at alumni day and we'll see what the membership thinks. At the next board meeting the amount will be finalized.

Merchandise Report – Ruth advised that the vendor states we need to have a minimum order of 24 shirts in an order. Mary & Ruth worked on the numbers of shirts and hats that would be ordered for alumni day. We have enough in stock of the other items. Ruth has been having trouble in receiving emails from Queensboro promotions. Kim asked if we should promo our items in Queensboro to the current recruit class and the answer was yes. Motion made by Kim to accept the merchandise report. A second was made by Ray, motion passes.

Alumni Day giveaways – Ray needs our tax exempt number for some of the donors he has spoken to. He has 3 committed donors so far – from Mullins Cheese, Knowlton House distillery and a fishing guide. Phil will contact some vendors in the Dells area.

History Committee Report – Dave C. sent an email to Tim White (who is the representative for the Troopers Benevolent Fund) to clarify that we want three storage cases and one wardrobe closet. The WTA is willing to spend up to \$10,000 to buy these items for us. We probably will not have them by alumni day. Mannequins have been ordered and cost us about \$700. They will be delivered to Joseph's house. Dave Harvey will get us a thumb drive of photos that will be used on the t.v. in the lobby area for alumni day. Motion by Ray to accept the history committee report was made and a 2<sup>nd</sup> by Phil. Motion passes. Submitted by Secretary Kim Hurley.
